# 1800 RESPECT (1800 737 732)

When you contact <u>1800 RESPECT</u>, you will talk to a trained counsellor who will listen and support you in what feels right for you and your situation. They will work to help identify what you can do and find the right services or support for you. 1800 RESPECT is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

#### <u> Lifeline – 13 11 14</u>

A short-term support for people who are feeling overwhelmed or having difficulty coping or staying safe. Confidential one to one support with a trained telephone crisis supporter.

#### <u>Kids Helpline – 1800 55 1800</u>

Kids Helpline is Australia's only free (even from a mobile), confidential 24/7 phone counselling service for young people aged 5 to 25. Kids Helpline is also available via WebChat.

#### **Relationships Australia**

Providing relationship support services for individuals, families and communities. Relationships Australia is a community-based, not-for-profit Australian organisation with no religious affiliations. Services are for all members of the community, regardless of religious belief, age, gender, sexual orientation, lifestyle choice, cultural background or economic circumstances.

#### **Additional financial support**

### **Escaping Violence Payment (Uniting)**

The Escaping Violence Payment trial will provide women with financial assistance of up to \$1,500 in cash with the remainder available for goods and services or direct payments of bonds, school fees or other support to help establish a safe home.

The UnitingCare Australia Consortium has been selected as the service provider to deliver the payments and will also support women to engage with other relevant services that support women and their children. This includes other Commonwealth or state and territory government funded community services.
