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### 1 Purpose

This policy sets out:

- (a) The criteria for assessment of awards by Australian Red Cross to volunteers, members, and employees of Australian Red Cross, including Lifeblood (Australian Red Cross People) and others in connection with work performed with or on behalf of Australian Red Cross to:
  - (i) Recognise and reward excellence.
  - (ii) Instil notions of best-practice and excellence throughout Australian Red Cross.
  - (iii) Boost morale and belonging of Australian Red Cross People.
  - (iv) Encourage loyalty and commitment of Australian Red Cross People.
  - (v) Provide a platform to showcase achievements of a diversity of Australian Red Cross People.



(b) The way awards medals and badges should be worn by Australian Red Cross People.

### 2 Scope and Audience

This policy applies to all Australian Red Cross People (which includes employees and volunteers of Lifeblood), and others eligible for awards.

### 3 Policy – Award eligibility criteria, assessment, and type

### 3.1 Honorary Life Membership

- (a) Honorary Life Membership is Australian Red Cross' peak award for achievement of the highest degree of service by Australian Red Cross People.
- (b) The eligibility, assessment criteria, when awarded and who assesses Honorary Life Membership is set out in Annexure 1.
- (c) Only the Board may approve or amend Annexure 1 of this policy.

## 3.2 Other Awards

The eligibility, assessment criteria, when awarded and who assesses the:

- (a) **Distinguished Service Award** is set out in Annexure 2.
- (b) **Outstanding Service Award** is set out in Annexure 3.
- (c) **Distinguished Staff Award** is set out in Annexure 4.
- (d) Meritorious Service Award is set out in Annexure 5.
- (e) Youth Meritorious Service Award is set out in Annexure 6.
- (f) International Service Award is set out in Annexure 7.
- (g) **Distinguished Team Award** is set out in Annexure 8.
- (h) Certificate of Commendation is set out in Annexure 9.
- (i) Humanitarian Partner Award is set out in Annexure 10.

### 3.3 Subsequent awards

- (a) No recipient of any award (including Honorary Life Membership) is prevented from being nominated for or applying for the same (except Honorary Life Membership, which can only be awarded once) or other awards where they meet the criteria.
- (b) Except where an individual is nominated for an individual and team award, an application in relation to the same operation or matter should not be made, however that operation or matter may be used in support of other applications for a nominee.
- (c) In the event the nominee has received the same award previously, a bar will be presented to be added to their existing medal.

### 3.4 Nomination

- (a) No individual or group may self-nominate for any award.
- (b) Posthumous awards may only be awarded in exceptional circumstances.

### 4 Policy – Wearing of medals and badges

- 4.1 Medals and badges awarded by Australian Red Cross:
  - (a) May be worn at any important Red Cross or public event.

**Example:** Important events include Australian Red Cross functions, other Red Cross/Red Crescent national society functions, World Red Cross Day, IFRC and ICRC events, ANZAC Day functions, Remembrance Day functions, Annual meetings and conferences of Australian Red Cross (including of National Council, divisions, zones and branches), funerals of Australian Red Cross People.

(b) Should not be worn with the uniforms of other organisations (including the military).

**Note:** The Florence Nightingale Medal is the exception as it is issued through the ICRC. Australian Defence Force permits the wearing of the Florence Nightingale Medal, or ribbon, according to the relevant regulation.

- (c) Must be worn with the senior medal nearest the centre, with the order of precedence being:
  - (i) Henry Dunant Medal (medal)
  - (ii) Florence Nightingale Medal (medal)
     Note: The Florence Nightingale Medal is worn separately above other Red Cross medals or badges (because of its nature), although the Henry Dunant Medal takes precedence.
  - (iii) Honorary Life Membership (medal)



- (iv) Medal of Honour (medal)
- (v) Distinguished Service Award (medal)
- (vi) Outstanding Service Award (medal)
- (vii) Distinguished Staff Award (medal)
- (viii) Meritorious Service Award (medal)
- (ix) Youth Meritorious Service Award (badge)
- (x) Long Service Medal (medal)
- (xi) Service Award (badge)
- (xii) Unofficial or division Award
- (xiii) Foreign Red Cross awards in date order
- (xiv) Other non-Red Cross medals in date order

**Note:** Care should be taken when having medals mounted, as regalia shops, and others, are used to mounting military medals, of which Australian Red Cross medals are the reverse.

(d) Are worn on the right breast, while official national decorations, medals, and ribbons (non-Red Cross awards) are worn on the left breast.

**Note:** Badges may be worn at any time. If more than one badge is worn, the Red Cross Youth Meritorious Service Award takes precedence and is worn nearest the centre.

- 4.2 No awards are worn on overcoats.
- 4.3 Medals, when worn, are suspended from the appropriate ribbon 4cm in length. The senior medal is worn nearest the centre and on the top row when more than one row is necessary. They are to be worn in order of precedence and may be attached individually, suspended from a bar, or court mounted. Five medals are worn to complete a row.
- 4.4 The Honorary Life Membership badge is only worn when medals are not being worn. It must be worn left of centre unless an Australian Honour badge is being worn, in which case the Honorary Life Membership badge may be worn right of centre. For Honorary Life Members who have a brooch, this may be worn at the throat of a shirt.

**Note:** The Honorary Life Member brooch is no longer issued however is still worn by members who have previously received a brooch.

- 4.5 Badges for awards are worn below the medals.
- 4.6 Service Awards should not be mounted on a ribbon or attached to any other award.
- 4.7 Aside from Australian Red Cross badges, normally no other badges are worn; however, badges for citations from other Red Cross or Red Crescent societies may be worn below medals and after Australian Red Cross badges.

**Note:** Membership badges, name badges, badges celebrating occasions and similar items should not be worn as if they are awards, nor in conflict with the regulations of any other organisation. Generally, an Australian Red Cross membership badge will be worn left of centre.

### 5.1 Definitions

Fundamental Principles	The seven Fundamental Principles (Humanity, Impartiality, Neutrality, Independence, Voluntary Service, Unity and Universality) sum up the global Movement's ethics and are at the core of its approach to helping people in all its activities at all times.

## Annexure 8 Distinguished Team Award

## Annexure 10 Humanitarian Partner Award

Who is eligible	Individuals, corporations, organisations, and government bodies who are not Australian Red Cross People
Minimum service required	Not applicable
Other requirements	(a) Evidence of a very close relationship between the nominee and Australian Red Cross
	(b) Evidence of nominee's service of an exceptional nature which has greatly assisted the work or reputation of Australian Red Cross
	<b>Note</b> : financial contributions by the nominee to Australian Red Cross may be considered for this award, but is not essential for nomination
	(c) The length and nature of relationship with Australian Red Cross
	<b>Examples:</b> Schools, donors, government bodies or statutory corporations who have worked to further the humanitarian work undertaken by Australian Red Cross
