Why does Red Cross need to collect this information?	<p>We need to collect this information so that we can do one, or more, of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • enable you to participate in our activities or provide you with information about our activities • to perform research and analysis to improve the way in which we engage with you as a supporter.
The primary purpose for which the information is being collected	The primary purpose of collecting this information is to complete a research project relating to the value and impact of IHL knowledge and training in the Australian humanitarian sector, in accordance with the Plain Language Statements and Consent forms relating to this project (available online here).
The secondary purposes (if any) for which Red Cross is collecting this information	The secondary purpose of collecting this information is to remain in contact with you regarding further research, training, and other opportunities relating to the value and impact of IHL knowledge and training for the Australian humanitarian sector in the future.

What happens if Red Cross doesn't collect this information?	If Red Cross does not collect this information from you, you will be unable to participate in this research project.
Anonymity/Nickname	While we will need information to be able to contact and communicate with you through the life of the project, you can elect to complete all surveys and interviews anonymously. You will also be able to elect for a pseudonym to be used in any publications.
The organisations we usually disclose this information to are	<p>We may disclose your information to third parties that provide services to us. This includes our third party service providers that provide us with IT, banking and other services which enable us to operate effectively.</p> <p>The information you provide to us over the life of the project will also be shared with Deakin University's Centre for Humanitarian Leadership via their secure file share system, Syncplicity, only for the purpose of conducting this research project.</p>
